SAMS is an Academic management system for students, parents, administrators at college and for Govt. to over come the challenges in the process of college admission. Through SAMS students applied online for admission and submit the same forms with relevant documents at the nearest SRC (SAMS Resource Centre). This type of process is time saving easy, economical and transparent for student. HRMS (Human Resource Management System)

is a software application that includes many functions like Administration, Requirement, Training and performance analysis. In HRMS an employee may apply leave, Loan and grievance through internet. PIMS (Personal Information Management System) is a way for recording and management of personal information of the employees. PAR (Performance Appraisal Report) PAR is a part of carrier development and consists of regular review of employee performance with organisation. All the employee of the institutions submit their PAR for each academic year in online mode. eScholarship Govt. of Odisha provide a number of scholarships for domicile students of Odisha. The eligibility condition to get a scholarships is the academic qualification and financial status of the students. All type of transactions in regard to scholarship are made online and the amount is directly transferred to the beneficiaries account.
