Course Outcome

SEM-I

Core-I (Understanding Political Theory)

To understand about political theory, its nature and scope and its relation with other social sciences to analyse political science as an interdisciplinary subject.

To acquaint the students with basic idea about different trends and approaches of political theory with highlighting the changing nature of political theory and emergence of new school of thought in the discipline.

Core-II (Constitutional Government and Democracy in India)

Knowledge gained about the constitutional structure and process in India and Understanding the making of Indian constitution.

Understand the structure, power and functions of the Indian government and enlighten the students to understand basic rights and duties of the citizen.

SEM-II

Core-III (Political Theory: Concepts and Debates)

The students will learn about the various concepts and approaches which will help them in getting and exploring as well as analysing various issues regarding the development of theories in Political Science. Students will have to study the basic role of political concepts by analysing, classifying and evaluating various theories which are important functionaries of day-to-day social life.

Core-IV (Political Process in India)

The students acquire knowledge of the various provisions that differentiate a party as a national party in India with justification presented by the norms stated by election commission of India.

Introduces the students to entities of caste, religion and region which have been great influencing actors in Indian politics.

Students will be familiar with the primary theories and concepts that form the building blocks of the comparison between systems and governments as they are applied to different states in the world.

SEM-III

Core-V (Introduction to Comparative Government and Politics)

Understanding and critically analysing the political system of U.S.A and CHINA and to understand historical context of modern government

Understand Contribution of David Easton and Almond for developing new approaches and theories like System Approach and Structural Functional Approach.

Core-VI (Introduction to Public Administration)

An elucidation on the evolution of the discipline of Public Administration and its multifarious ideas and concepts guiding the governance structure of a country as well as an appraisal of the Indian administrative system.

To gain the knowledge on the historical background of Public Administration as the discipline and its relations with other social sciences.

Core-VII (Perspective on International Relations)

To understand the meaning of international Politics and its nature and scope by highlighting its differences with international relations and given the basic idea about different approaches to the study of international relation and tries to analyse the present order from the perspective of those approaches. Demonstrate a knowledge of the key dimensions, events and processes of international relations within their historic context, such as: the formation of the modern state system, the Treaty of Westphalia, the evolution of global capitalism, the origins of the Cold War, the shift to the post-Cold War system, the role of race, gender and class in the structure of the modern world system, major conflicts such as the world wars, US intervention in various places in the world, ascendant conflicts, the features and effects of globalizing market capitalism, growing environmental problems and human rights.

Core-VIII (Political Processes and Institutions in Comparative Perspective)

To introduce students to the theoretical perspectives in Political Science inquiry on the nature, role and functions of political institutions.

To provide comparative perspectives on the ways in which political institutions function in different countries.

Understand that different political institutions play the specific roles in the political process in different contexts.
